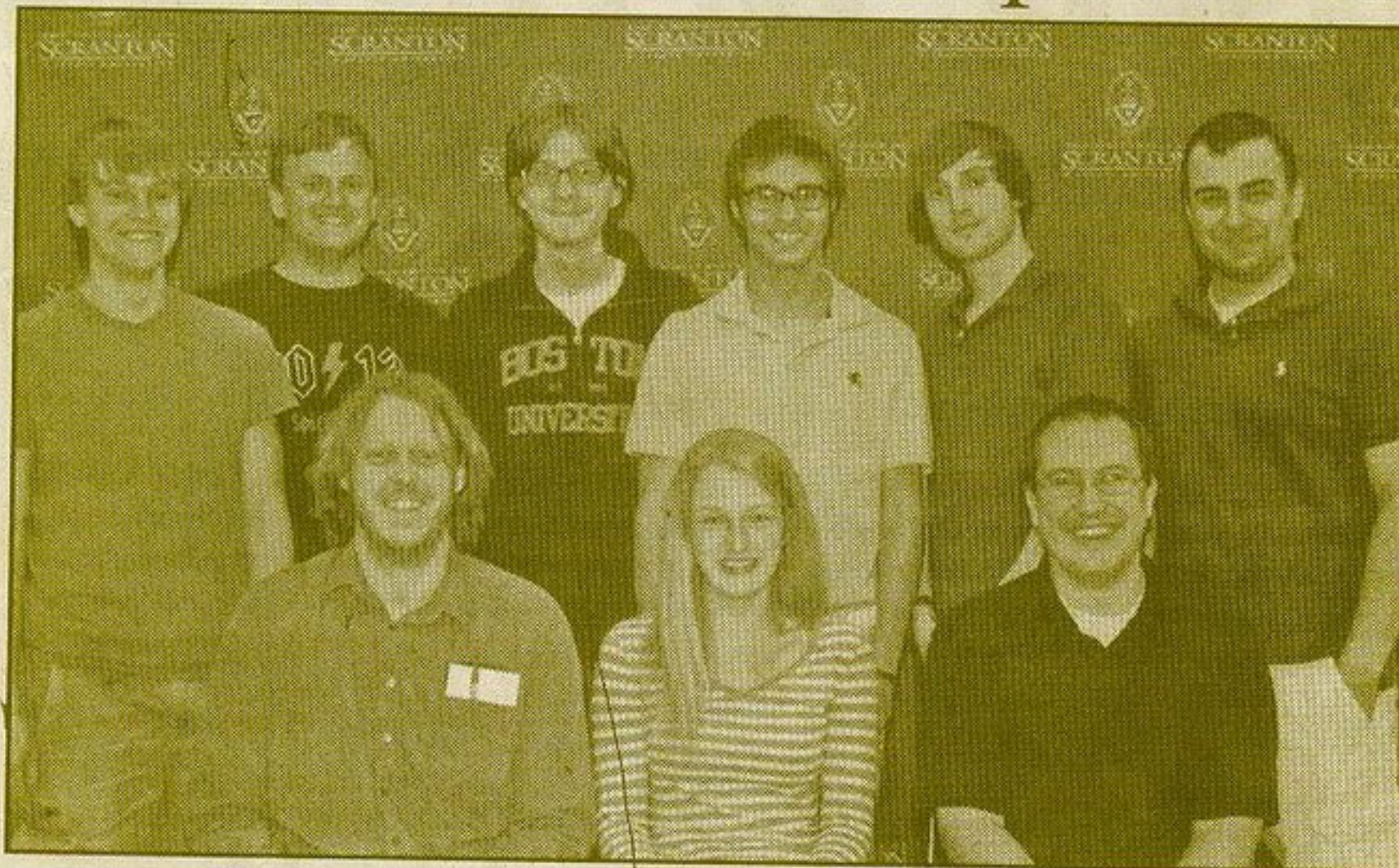

High school students shine at annual Kane Competition

More than 150 high school students from the region put their physics and engineering skills to the test to save superheroes caught in a series of hands-on "challenges" at The University of Scranton's ninth annual Kane Competition held recently on campus.

Twenty teams of students, representing 13 high schools, competed in teams and individually.

For the competition's major event, students were challenged to use an energy-pumping device to activate a 12-foot pendulum to crash through a wall in order to free superheroes trapped inside a villain's hideout.

First, second and third place winning teams were named in the overall competition.
